We are pleased to inform you that we will be implementing a new policy at **Newberry Elementary and Yermo School** (for 2018-2019) called the **Community Eligibility Provision**. This is made available to eligible schools participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Programs (SBP)


What does this mean for you and your child(ren) attending the school(s) identified above?

Great news for you and your students! **All** enrolled students of Newberry Elementary and Yermo School are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch during school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2018-2019 school year! No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit an application. Households will still need to submit a confidential household income survey necessary for other funding, however, the completion of the income survey will not change NSLP/SBP status.

If you have children attending other schools in our district, you must still submit an application for Free and Reduced-Priced meals for those students. All household members must be counted on the application, even those attending Newberry Elementary and/or Yermo School.
